Kestrels' Learning

To kick off our spring 'Rivers' topic we worked in pairs to create models of a river's journey from source to mouth. The children were introduced to key vocabulary such as 'source,' 'tributaries,' 'estuary,' 'delta,' 'mouth,' 'oxbow lake' and 'meander.' We will be travelling around the world exploring rivers across the continents and closer to home to make comparisons of size, climate, communities and terrain. The children will build on their prior knowledge from last term where we looked at the importance of the River Tiber in the growth of the Roman Empire. They will recognise our reliance on waterways for survival but also explore the risks to communities due to flooding.





Doves' Learning

Doves have started their science unit on habitats. In continuous provision, we have been exploring large habitats such as woodlands, deserts and oceans. We have tried to create our own scenes. We had fun exploring our outdoor environment to look for microhabitats.







School Meal Costs

As you know, the cost of living is unfortunately rising and this is impacting our school meals.

For now, school will continue to subsidise the cost of these, meaning, if you pay for meals, the cost to parents will remain at £2.55 for now. The cost to school for these is £2.75 saving you £1.00 a week, for 5 meals! If there are any changes to this, and we need to increase the price you pay, we will of course let you know.

Robins' Learning

The Robins have been busy learning a range of new nursery rhymes. We have been exploring each new nursery rhyme in more detail by identifying things which happened in the past.

On Wednesday we found that Humpty Dumpty had fell off the wall! We then explored what was inside the first aid kit and talked about what we would do in an emergency. We also sang Miss Polly had a dolly and learnt how to do some weaving so that we could make a little blanket for her.

In Eagles, we have launched our new geography unit 'Sustainability' looking at the physical geographical features of the Amazon Rainforest.

We explored the four different layers of the Rainforest - emergent layer, canopy, understorey and forest floor - and turned this into an exciting classroom display. With the help of Miss Hodkinson, we populated this with animals that could be found on each layer and made leaves for the top two layers. Looks great, doesn't it?
