Eagles' STEM Challenge!

On Thursday 1st February, we participated in a live stream STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) day, which was run by the RAF charitable team.

It was a brilliant day and we all really enjoyed it. Our morning was spent looking at aerospace engineering and we designed, made and then tested out three different types of gliders. Using our maths skills, we recorded our data for distance and time and then turned this into speed - our top speed was nearly 8 kilometres per hour! Then in the looked afternoon. we at sustainability of aerospace engineering and we designed a sustainable aircraft for the future. Our top entry for the class, will go into a national competition to win tickets to the Royal International Air Tattoo show - Albie and Rhys' design will represent Burntstump since they thought about how to power their craft sustainably and made their aircraft from recycled metal. Fingers crossed for us!

Kestrels had a fantastic time on our school trip this week. The children demonstrated fantastic knowledge of rivers and their features. They worked well in teams building models of a river's key features out of natural materials and exhibited bravery and resilience when tackling our water-based activities. We also started а new topic in mathematics focusing on measuring. To kick start this, we our learning outside took measuring how far children could jump, logging and sharing data.

The Robins' class started their trip by looking for the three little pigs in the woodland. We looked for signs and clues and then retold the story in our own words usina props and costumes. We then walked to a bridge and looked for the troll from the three billy goats gruff.
